- Novelty of research approach
- Strength of evidence and argumentation
- Originality of contributions to the field

Practical Usefulness for History Education (40%)

- Implementable findings for history education practice
- Clarity of educational conditions of use of the research findings
- Attention to differentiation and inclusion in educational contexts

Composition and Style (10%)

- Clarity and coherence
- Accessibility to both academic and practitioner audiences
- Quality of written communication
