Message from the EuroClio President

Dear Friends and Members of Euroclio,

It is a pleasure to welcome you to the 31st Euroclio Annual Conference in Bratislava!

The title of the conference, “Patterns in History?” encapsulates well the challenges many historians, history and civics teacher, and everybody interested in history faces when trying to grasp the nature of history. Historians have debated over the validity – and usefulness – of using the idea of patterns to explain the nature of change and continuity, cause and consequence. EH Carr said that “the historian’s business is to study the relations between past and future, and to understand the patterns in which they are linked.” Isaiah Berlin counters this by stating that “there is no single grand pattern to history, only an unpredictable tangle of human actions and events.” To show this tension, we decided to add a question mark to the title and hope that this will lead to interesting discussions during the conference.

This year’s conference is in many ways quite extraordinary as we are honoured to have distinguished historian and educational psychologist Sam Wineburg as our keynote speaker. More than 300 participants have the opportunity to choose from over 40 workshops as well as school visits, research focus groups, cultural visits and many more educational activities. Among those facilitating high-level workshops is the House of European History, OHTE, the Arolsen Archives and Historiana’s teaching and learning team. We are sure that all participants will be able to find inspiring and useful ideas to take back home.

The local organising team in Bratislava CEDIN, the Bratislava City Museum, the National Memory Institute, NIVAM, the Comenius University and Euroclio want to thank you for your presence and hope that this event sparks insightful discussions, meaningful connections and new ideas.

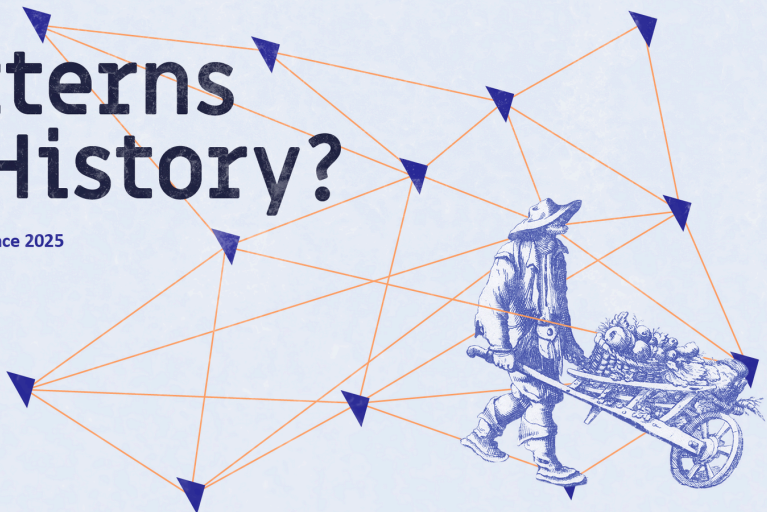

The Slovak Lines bus to Bratislava leaves from Wien Hauptbahnhof, Hbf Wiedner Gürtel and platform C1. The bus continues to Vienna International Airport in front of the departure hall to platform no. 4 and ends at the Nivy Bus station in Bratislava. The easiest way to buy a ticket is directly from the bus driver.

When booking the tickets, please make sure to specify where you are travelling from (Vienna Airport or Vienna city centre). In Bratislava, the closest bus stop from the hotels is called Bratislava Most SNP.

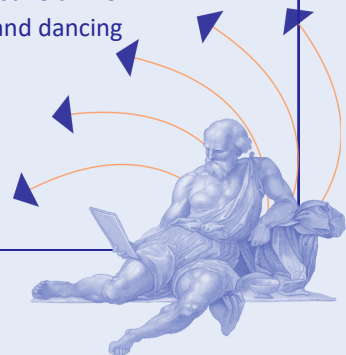

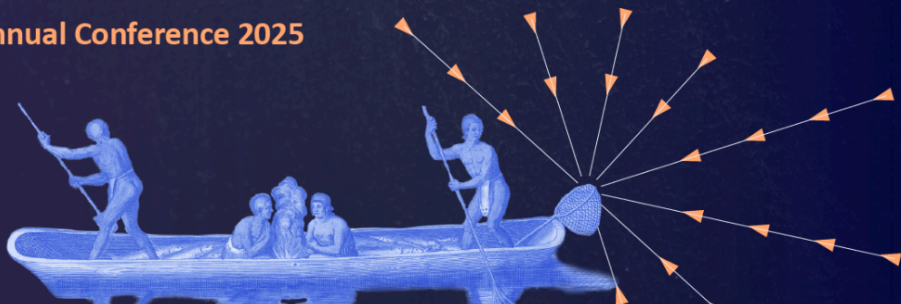
