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| Who are we?

EuroClio is the European Association of History Educators. It was established in 1992 on request of the Council of Europe to build bridges between history education professionals from all parts of the then recently reunited Europe.

Our mission is to inspire and empower educators to engage learners in innovative and responsible history and citizenship education. Our vision is for all learners to become more responsible and contributing citizens through engaging in history and citizenship education for mutual understanding and peace.

EuroClio supports the development of responsible and innovative history, citizenship, and heritage education by promoting critical thinking, multiperspectivity, mutual respect, and the inclusion of controversial issues. The Association advocates for the sound use of history and heritage education to build and deepen democratic societies, connecting professionals across the boundaries of communities, countries, ethnicities and religions. It seeks to enhance the quality of history and citizenship education through capacity-building for educators and by producing and implementing innovative teaching tools.

EuroClio is a democratic Association that brings together other democratic associations at its General Assembly. This body adopts overall planning, elects and discharges board members, and follows good governance procedures.

| What will you do?

This volunteering project offers a unique opportunity not only to have a great learning experience but also to make a difference in the lives of others. EuroClio focuses on inclusive education and collaborative community building. You will be part of a team comprising Staff members and Trainees who are still registered at a university.

You will be assigned a mentor, and, together with Trainees and another long-term volunteer, you will work on projects within the EuroClio ecosystem.

During your stay, we will welcome guests, residents, Trainees and sometimes even the Board, who could stay at the EuroClio Residence or in the neighbourhood. Which means that even if there are only two long-term volunteers in the European Solidarity Corps programme, you will be surrounded by a team.

| Who are we looking for?

We are looking for **two volunteers** between the ages of 20 and 30 who are enthusiastic, open-minded, and motivated, eager to make a positive impact on society, learn new skills, and live in and experience a different country and culture.

What qualities are we looking for?

- Motivated to take initiative, learn, and try new things
- Keen interest in history and citizenship education
- Perfect command of English
- Ready to work in a multicultural team
- Friendly, empathetic, and eager to connect with others

To create more possibilities for our volunteers, there are two different profiles that you can apply for:

Network of Concerned Historians Researcher

Help document censorship of history, build a global digital archive and memorial, and support advocacy campaigns for persecuted historians. You will gain hands-on experience in research, digital archiving, and outreach while contributing to the protection of ethical historical research worldwide.

Outreach & Communications Team Member

Support outreach efforts that strengthen history, heritage, and citizenship education across Europe. Contribute to research and content creation, help edit the podcasts, support communication campaigns and digital strategy, gaining hands-on experience in social media production and project coordination while helping history educators access innovative resources.

| Working schedule

You are expected to work 30-34 hours a week.

Your main activity will be to help out at the EuroClio Secretariat on the projects you are assigned. Your specific tasks will depend on the role you are applying for:

- Network of Concerned Historians
- Outreach & Communications

The EuroClio Secretariat is a welcoming place where people from different backgrounds and generations learn from one another and create together.

EuroClio has flexible working hours; we generally start between 09:00 and 10:00 and finish between 17:00 and 18:00. It is your call to adapt your working days to tasks and responsibilities; keep in mind that not every week will have the same schedule. Some weeks will lean much more heavily on some tasks than on others, for example, when events are taking place.

The percentages of working hours have been calculated based on the entire volunteering project. We think it is important to get rest and explore your new home city, so you are entitled to 2 days off per month. It is important that you communicate with your mentor and with the team when you take those days off.

| Practical arrangements

You will stay in the Archipelbuurt in The Hague and be housed in the EuroClio Secretariat building on the second floor. EuroClio has renovated this floor to offer volunteers a private room, as well as a shared bathroom and kitchen/living room.

This space will be shared among the two long-term volunteers, the Trainees, and guests. Everything you need is close-by, including stores, parks, and the beach! The floor is equipped with a laundry machine.

Keep in mind that you might be living in a mixed-gender household.

Sometimes, the EuroClio Secretariat organises joint lunches and dinners, but most of the time, volunteers are free to cook together or for themselves in their kitchen.

The centre of The Hague is about 20 minutes away by public transport, and we can offer bikes for every volunteer to move around freely!

As part of your volunteering contract, you will receive pocket money in line with European Solidarity Corps standards every month. This amount is based on the year you are volunteering and the country in which you are volunteering. This will be discussed at the beginning of the volunteering period.
